Vocational Education and Training is an important aspect of the nation's educational system. It offers specialized and practical knowledge to an individual in a particular field by having an indepth study of the specific subject. It also helps one in preparing to get the desired job for a successful career. To support the above concept, NRMCW has achieved a great success by imparting vocational trainings in the fields of hand embroidery, basic sewing operation, fundamentals of basic computer, tally, beauty culture and hair dressing, spoken English and communication skills, media and many more. During this fiscal year we have organized more than 150 batches and about 3000 students have passed the vocational training examinations in various trades. Thanks to M.P. Council for Vocational Education and Training (MPCVET) Bhopal!

Empowerment of women especially mothers are not only essential for equity, but also constitute a critical element in our fight for poverty reduction, economic growth and strengthening of civil society. It is even more important as she nourishes, nurture and moulds the character of her offspring. Under the scheme for Leadership Development of Minority women, (Nai Roshani) NRMCW organized trainings for 125 Muslim women in Bhopal. We have also organized trainings in basic computer, tally and personality development in Bhopal, Raisen, Biora, Bina and Jabalpur for 225 OBC and minority candidates by getting support from M.P. OBC & Minority Finance and Development Corporation, Bhopal.

With the support from National Institute of Rural Development, Hyderabad, we have organized vocational trainings in diesel pump repairs and motor winding at Babai district Hoshangabad and two wheelers repairs at Hoshangabad for 25 candidates in each batch. These trainings were specially organized to promote the *sense of self-employment*. We have also organized trainings at Itarsi in computer fundamentals, MS Office, Internet and tally for 30 candidates under SJSY scheme with the support of DUDA Hoshangabad.

Apart from the above, to support RNTCP scheme, NRMCW is continually giving its services for the collection of sputum, DOT support in district Rajgarh, with the help of DTO Rajgarh. For SABLA program, by getting support from ICDS Motia park, Barkhedia and Kolar Road, Bhopal, we have rendered skill development training to more than 500 girls in the age group 14-18 years. We are will keep continue our efforts to serve the humanity in coming years as we have done in the past.

Activities

Madhya Pradesh Council for Vocational Education and Training (MPCVET)

Madhya Pradesh Council for Vocational Education & Training (MPCVET) is a body under the chairmanship of Honorable Chief Minister of Madhya Pradesh to act as the apex body for monitoring, coordination, convergence and providing overall policy direction for skill development activities in Madhya Pradesh. NRMCW as a registered Vocational Training Provider have organized more than 150 batches for the trainings in various trades viz. computer fundamental, Tally, Hand embroidery, Basic sewing operation, Beautician and hair dresser, Communication skills and spoken English, Media, Data Entry Operation and

more. Our VTP centers are situated in Bhopal, Narsinghgarh, Biora, Bina, Mandideep, Athner, Betul and Jabalpur. One of the advantages of vocational training is that it focuses on practical skills that candidates can put to use in a job immediately. About 45% of candidates have either got the job or have started their own ventures.





Nai Roshani- The Scheme for Leadership Development of Minority women

With the support from Ministry of Minority Affairs New Delhi, NRMCW has rendered trainings to 125 Mulslim women in Bhopal for 6 days. The subjects covered were leadership of women, life skills, time management, health & hygiene and motivation. During the training audio-visual aids were used and case studies were discussed by expert trainers. The trainees women were in the age group of 18 to 45 years and their family income was not more than Rs.2.50 lacs p.a. It was very successful training. At the end of the training all the participants were given the certificates in token of their presence in the training program.





Vocational training for Minority and OBC groups

NRMCW has organized vocational trainings for minority and OBC candidates (boys and girls) in Bhopal, Jabalpur, Raisen, Bina and Biora. 225 candidates were selected through advertisement in the new papers and were given the trainings for computer fundamentals, MS Office, Internet, Tally beautician and Personality Development. The assessing bodies authorized by the department of OBC and Minority Finance and Development Corporation Bhopal assessed the students. 45% candidates were helped to get the job or start their own business.





NERD supported training programs in diesel pump repairs and motor winding-Babai dist. Hoshangabad

A 45 days training program has been organized at Babai district Hoshangabad in diesel pump repairs and motor winding for 25 candidates. This program was sponsored by National Institute of Rural Development, Hyderabad. The main aim of the program was self-employment. It was an intensive training in which the trainees were encouraged to establish their own business instead of go for search of a job in the market. It was a successful training as after the training 12-14 candidates have started their own business and others also in process of the same.



NERD supported training programs in two wheeler repairs-Hoshangabad

To inculcate the feeling of self employment, a training and skill upgradation program of rural youth geared towards entrepreneurship development was organized at Hoshangabad. A 45 days training program for 25 youth has been implemented in two wheeler repairs trade. This program was also sponsored by National Institute of Rural Development, Hyderabad. All the participants were trained by experts in repairing two wheelers. After the training, a closing ceremony was arranged in which RSETI's Project Director Shri O.N.Bansal interacted with the trainees and distributed them the tool kit and certificates. Out of 25 candidates, 15 candidates have started their own ventures and remaining are in process of the same. NRMCW is closely in touch with the trainees.



DUDA Hoshangabad-Training in Computer fundamentals, MS Office & Tally

Under SJSY scheme, NRMCW was supported by DUDA Hoshangabad to organize a training of 30 candidates at Itarsi in computer fundamentals, MS Office and Tally trades. During the training period of 3 months, all the participants were given training of experienced trainers. A mock test was organized in every 15 days to evaluate the progress of the training. After the successful completion of the program, 40% participants got the job in local institution. The remaining candidates are also being helped to get the job.



W & CD SABLA training program

Under the program "Rajiv Gandhi Scheme for Empowerment of Adolescent Girls (SABLA), the skill development program were organized for the adolescent girls. This training program was supported by ICDS Motia park, Barkhedi and Kolar Road Bhopal. More than 500 girls were trained in computer fundamentals, MS Office and Internet, Tally, hand embroidery, basic sewing operator, beauty culture and hair dressing and spoken English. All the successful candidates were given certificates from Ministry of Employment and Training New Delhi as the candidates were assessed by authorized assessing body of the MPCVET.



Akshya Project- Biora & Narsinghgarh

NRMCW is rendering its services in the field of collection of sputum from the villages of blocks Biora and Narsinghgarh. Our representatives also help to find the TB patients and refer them to DOT centre. This program is being supported by CBCI-CARD New Delhi. Presently we are working about 40 villages of the blocks. This program is the part of Project Akshaya which aims to improve access to quality TB care and control through a partnership between government and civil society.



Survey among the fisher women at Hoshangabad

NRMCW organized a survey among the fisher women at Hoshangabad to know the potentiality of some beneficial program for them. About 500 fisher women were

contacted and discussions were held with them. NRMCW was interested to know if these women were interested in opportunities for increased female involvement in fisheries. Where they were lacking in skills? How to build their capacity? A team of 10 persons was engaged and sent to Hoshangabad to collect the data. This exercise was fruitful as we were able to know what can be done for them.

Coaching for PCM and Spoken English

NRMCW is organizing free of cost coaching for poor boys and girls at their Biora district Rajgarh and Ranjhi district Jabalpur centers. This is being done since last eight months. This is done in 2 batches. 60 students are selected at each center to give them the coaching by subject specialist. All the poor candidates who are needy are eligible to attend this coaching. The students are provided with course notes and proper guidance to enhance their capabilities in desired subject.

Community Library

A Community Library has been set up for the rural youth at our VTP center at Biora district Rajgarh. There are 400 books in the library. Newspapers in English and Hindi as well as magazines on health, computers, sports, general knowledge, etc., are provided to help the rural youth to stay connected with the outside world. Employment News as well as other employment related information is also provided.

World Environment Day- 5th June 2013



The theme for this year's World Environment Day celebrations is Think.Eat.Save. Think.Eat.Save is an anti-food waste and food loss campaign that encourages you to reduce your foodprint. According to the UN Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), every year 1.3 billion tons of food is wasted. This is equivalent to the same amount produced in the whole of sub-Saharan Africa. At the same time, 1 in every 7 people in the world go to bed hungry and more than 20,000 children under the age of 5 die daily from hunger. NRMCW's officials and staff took part to celebrate the day. We visited nearby villages of Bhopal and distributed free plants to the villagers who planted them at their home and surroundings. Every year NRMCW has a practice to plant the trees on this day.

World AIDS Day- 1st December 2013



World AIDS Day was celebrated on 1 December every year to raise awareness about HIV/AIDS and to demonstrate international solidarity in the face of the pandemic. The day is an opportunity for public and private partners to disseminate information about the status of the pandemic and to encourage progress in HIV/AIDS prevention, treatment and care around the world. NRMCW's officials and staff celebrated this day and organized a small rally to spread awareness about HIV aids.

Word Water Day- 22nd March 2014

World Water Day 2014 was observed on 22 March. The United Nations, which instituted the practice in 1993, has said this year's theme is "energy and water". According to the UN, energy and water are interdependent. Generation and transmission of major energy sources such as hydroelectric, nuclear, and thermal power require water resources. Conversely, about 8% of global energy is used for pumping, treating and transporting water. The focus is especially on the "bottom billion who live in slums and impoverished rural areas and survive without access to safe drinking water, adequate sanitation, sufficient food and energy services". NRMCW staff visited nearby slums and advised them about the importance of safe water. We also advised them to save water from misuse.



World TB Day-24th March 2014

TB is curable, but our current efforts to find, treat and cure everyone who gets ill with the disease are not sufficient. Of the nine million people a year who get sick with TB, a third of them are "missed" by public health system. Many of these three million people live in the World's poorest, most vulnerable communities and include groups such as migrants,

miners, drug users and sex workers. We believe that no one should be left behind in the fight against TB. NRMCW supports this and we will do our best to find, treat and cure the three million and accelerate progress towards zero TB deaths, infections, suffering and stigma. NRMCW is working in district Rajgarh with the sponsorship of CBCI-CARD and helping to find, treat and cure the persons who are suffering with TB.
